 FLUID EXPOSURE**

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Apply first aid: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Clean exposed area with soap and water for at least 15 minutes. 2. *In the State of Texas, you have the right to the identification, documentation, testing, and results of the source individual infectious disease status. Arrangements should be made immediately with your department; or the UT Student Health Clinic; or the hospital where the incident takes place for testing the source individual. Source individual testing should include HIV antibody, Hepatitis C antibody, and Hepatitis B surface antigen.
